Road update:

I have received word from my Argo rep that the work for town roads for this year is completed. They have received our ideas for what we would appreciate to be done for next year and hope these requests are scheduled in next year's budget.

The Seymour Arm Main Road has become a victim of the extreme rain we have experienced over the last month. There are numerous potholes developed on our super highway, most of which are unavoidable and many which are quite deep. They will now be with us till things dry up again in the spring. All is too wet now for any repairs to be effectively made. They did some re-alignment, adjusting the elevation on the corner at kilometre 7.5. This has given better sightline, for a greater distance.

The local roads are also showing the same impact from all the rain. Many potholes, so little room to avoid them.

The winter's snow cannot be far away and the graded snow road should help with these rough areas until the spring thaw. While the road is smooth though, please remember it is faster and needs your special attention to keep it safer.
